We have a responsibility, as parents choosing to send our children to school at DS, to help out with all the major fundraisers that help make it possible for our school to exist. Without this fundraiser roughly \$300 would be added to each child's tuition.

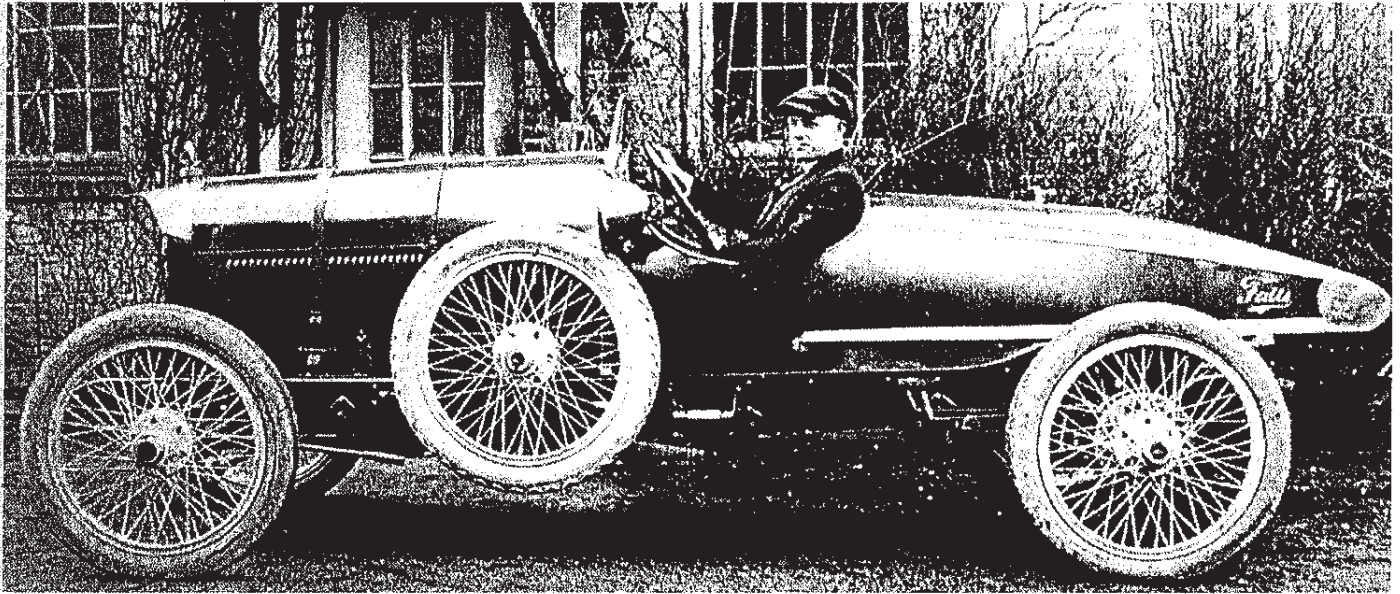

The Roaring 20s in Sheboygan County

The decade of the 1920s was one of change. It began with Prohibition and women voting. It saw the jazzy Charleston Dance, the revealing Flapper dress, the groundbreaking discovery of insulin and penicillin, and the culinary inventions of bubble gum and the bread slicer. It came crashing to an end beginning on that “Black Thursday” in October 1929.

“Third Saturdays” are a great way to meet history experts, local history buffs, and learn about our local history through displays, presentations, demonstrations, local history handouts, historic videos and hands-on activities. Series programs are held the third Saturday of the month,
