I have more student achievements to share with you! Recently our students entered some essay competitions sponsored by Amvets.

One essay was about drug and alcohol abuse. In that competition, eighth grader Ari Miske took first place and her entry has been forwarded to the state level competition. Annie Steffes (gr. 8) took second place and Jasmine Bink (gr. 7) took third place.

The other essay focused on Americanism. Annie Steffes again took second place and Greta Schaeuble (gr. 6) took third place.

1st-3rd place winners are being invited to the Amvets meeting on May 20 to receive their awards.

Amvets wished to also recognize six honorable mention winners from Divine Savior School: Kaylee Voland (gr. 6), Armando Cruz (gr. 7), Grace Hunsader (gr. 7), Paytin Noordyk (gr. 6), Trevin Heller (gr. 7), and Mason Schneider (gr. 8).

The Delta Kappa Gamma Sigma State Mary Jo Nettesheim Memorial Literary Competition concluded its state level competition. State Illustrator Awards were given to Jasmine Bink and Kaylee Voland. Honorable Mention for writing went to Jenna Grundl.

The fourth graders participated in the Farm Bureau essay contest. Madalyn Novak won first place. Her essay now advances to the district level and hopefully on to state. Deidre Schuler took second place. Since Madalyn captured first place in the county, her class will be treated to an ice cream party by the Farm Bureau. The Farm Bureau also choose our school as this year's recipient of ten books focusing on agriculture.

Your child (if in grades 5K-8) is bringing home his/her Spring MAP test **today** for your review. The testing company acknowledges that students tend to take a dip in scores for the Spring test. We do our best to encourage students to take their time and use good test taking skills. 6% of the students scored in the top ten percent nationally in all of the test areas. 22% of the students scored in the top ten percent in at least one subject. 45% students scored in the top 20 percent nationally in one or more subjects.

Congratulations to all our students for their outstanding efforts.

At Mass next Tuesday, we will have a special prayer for all those who were memorialized in the annual giving collection as well as recognizing those who were honored as part of a donor's gift. All donors will be prayed for as well. Some late donations brought our collection to \$33,450. Thank you again to all who supported this annual fundraiser for the school.

VIOLIN CLASSES 2021 - 2022 Academic Year

QUICK FACTS:

- Group Classes start using mock violins provided by the teacher - You do not need a violin to begin!
- After 2-3 weeks of classes each student should buy or rent a violin
(the teacher will advise about sizing and rates)
- Registration for each session of 6 Group Classes costs \$60.00
- No need to sign up for the whole year at once - there will be 5 sessions built into the school year calendar and you can decide about renewing your registration with each new session.
- Group classes last 45 minutes and take place during the school day once per week
- Students will have at least 2 opportunities to perform each year as a group and as soloists

The 100m runners should CHECK IN (at the Northwest corner of the track) at 8:50am so that we can start promptly at 9am.

Field events will be shot put, discus and long jump. These events start at 8:45am and can be done during an athlete's down time between running events, but need to be concluded not later than 10:45am.

In field events, you can have 4 entries per grade level, per gender. So you can have 16 girls and 16 boys for each field event.

We will run combined grade individual and relay running events... it will be 4 entries per 5/6 grade level and 7/8 grade level not 4 per 5,6,7,8 grade level. So for each running event you get 8 girls and 8 boy runners. You get (2) relay teams for the 4X100M and 4X200M per gender but Only (1) relay team for the 800M medley relay.
