MAP testing for the Spring begins next week and will continue after Easter. 5K will be testing on Monday and Tuesday. All other students will test the two weeks following Easter vacation. Please encourage your child to do his/her best on these tests.

The third quarter ends on Wednesday, March 31. Report cards will be sent home on April 8.

The Communication Center, a religion resource for Catholic schools, sponsored an essay contest for fifth and sixth grade students. The essay contest, entitled Christ is Alive, required students to address the topic "How Can I Be Closer to God?" Paytin Noordyk and AJ Harper received recognition for the best essays at the local level and will now be judged at the national competition with winners to be announced in May. At Mass this past Tuesday, Fr. Carl presented both students with religious medals and blessed them upon presentation. Congratulations to Paytin and AJ !

We have completed the annual giving fundraiser. Thank you very much for your support of Divine Savior School. We met our goal by collecting over \$32,000 from nearly 140 donors. Some of that money was designated to be added to the Endowment Fund and some for replacing our old chrome books. The support shown by school families, staff, and parishioners was truly incredible and a real blessing for the school.

The calendar for 2021-2022 is now on the school website along with the 2021-2022 school supply list. Both are included with this newsletter as well. You will get a better quality of these documents if you print them from the website. The calendar is color-coded for additional clarity. Also, if your child is the oldest in the family, a copy was sent home today. Please ask for it.

On Tuesday Officer Kempf, the Kiel Police liaison officer, will be speaking to students in grades 4-8 about social media apps and games like Fortnite and Roblox and the dangers of chatting and speaking with people they do not know. The teachers have been very concerned about things the students are saying regarding their involvement in these games and various sites. If you have any questions or concerns you would like addressed, please send me an email and I will make sure he addresses those concerns with the students. Parents with younger children might also want to be aware that some of these students are also obsessed with this stuff, not paying attention in class due to daydreaming about Fortnite.

On April 8 we are having a health professional speak to students in grades 4-8 about mental health issues. Some students are dealing with anxiety and hopefully the speaker will give them insights in how to deal with stress and worry.

WCRIS (Wisconsin Council of Religious and Independent Schools) has asked us to convey the following message and ask that you take a moment to send an email, via a quick link below, to our two Wisconsin senators.

YOUR ACTION NEEDED

Stop Attack on Private School Freedoms

Faith leaders from the religious organizations that underwrite and sponsor many WCRIS school groups are urging its school boosters to contact U.S. Senators Tammy Baldwin and Ron Johnson, to ask them to oppose the [Equality Act \(H.R. 5\)](#), which is intended to “prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex, gender identity, and sexual orientation, and for other purposes.”

In February, the bill passed in the US House and is now being considered by the Senate. Both Senators have strong beliefs in this area of the law and likely won't change their

minds, **however by reaching out you may help temper their zeal and you can inform them about how seriously this will affect their constituents.** This advocacy can have an enormous influence on how they lobby their Senate leaders to schedule the bill for a vote, or whether a vigorous filibuster is waged. If they detect strong opposition from the folks back home, they may be more likely to allow their leaders to leave the bill in committee.

Religious leaders stress that everyone deserves to be treated with respect and dignity. They also point out that the Act, in many ways, does the opposite. Instead of respecting differences in beliefs about marriage and sexuality, the Equality Act would discriminate against people of faith.

The Equality Act would:

- punish faith-based organizations, such as charities and schools who serve everyone in their communities, simply because of their beliefs;
- force girls and women to compete against boys and men for limited opportunities in sports, and to share locker rooms and shower spaces with biological males who identify as women;
- force people in everyday life, and especially health care workers, to support gender transition;
- and expand what the government considers a “public” place, forcing even some church halls to host functions that conflict with the sponsoring church’s beliefs.

Please urge Senators Baldwin and Johnson to oppose it. You can email Senators Baldwin and Johnson through the contact forms on their individual websites.

Or, you can use this [quick advocacy link](#) provided by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). They are the only religious school group with a quick link to email the senators, and they invite you to use it, even if you are not Catholic.
