Fees:

The fee for each class is noted in the Class Descriptions. There is no additional charge for Kiel School District residents or open-enrolled students of Kiel schools. Fees are payable online through Family Access using **a parent’s login ID and password** between Wednesday, May 5th and Friday, May 28th. You will not be sent a billing statement. The amount to be paid is shown on the student’s registration page on the website.

These fees must be paid before the start of summer school classes.

Students who live out-of-district must pay an additional \$20.00 fee to register. See below for more information for out-of-district students.

BUS TRANSPORT –

- **Register your student for Bus Transportation by adding one of the following:**
- **“Transport Bus Home PU” In Period 0** if your child needs to be picked up at your home address before school.
- **“Transport Bus DCare PU” in Period 0**, if your child needs to be picked up at an address **different** than your home address.
- **“Trans Bus Home” in Period 7** if they will be riding the school bus to your home address after summer school
- **“Transport Bus Daycare DO ” in Period 7**, if they will be riding the bus to **daycare or to a different** address then home after summer school.
- (Bus registration is not needed for shuttle busing between classes.)

- **New bus routes are established for Summer School that are different from the school-year arrangements. If your student will be picked up or dropped off at any address besides your home mailing address, you must notify the Summer School office by May 1st. (894-2265 or summerschool@kiel.k12.wi.us).**
- If we are not contacted by May 1st, students will be picked up at their home residence of Family 1, according to Skyward.
- If your summer arrangements are not finalized by May 1st please inform us that your child might have alternate pick-up/drop-off locations. We will stay in touch as you finalize plans.

Swim Classes:

- Classes are open to students registering for other Summer School classes and to students preferring to take only Swim Class. Swim classes are offered Periods 1- 6.
- **Age Limit:** To participate in Swim classes children must turn four (4) years old by June 1, 2021. All students must be willing to stay with their instructor and group for the entire class time.

*****(MS) ARTS & CRAFTS (2-3) - Period: 3 & 4 (grades 2-3 / limit 22) Cost \$12.00**

This class will allow children to be creative and have fun! We will create fun crafts and take care of the planet at the same time! We will transform recyclables/toss-ables, nature, and art materials into creative, fun, and functional creations!

*****(MS) ARTS & CRAFTS (4-8) - Period: 1 & 2 (grades 4-8 / limit 22) Cost \$12.00**

This class will allow children to be creative, have fun, and take care of the planet at the same time! Students will learn that art is found in many forms by completing projects using a variety of mediums, including materials found in nature, recyclables/toss-ables, and art materials. We will transform these materials into creative, fun, and functional creations!

(ZE) AWESOME ART (5K-1) – Periods: 1, 2, & 4 (grades 5K-1 / limit 20) Cost \$14.00

Art is all around us. During this class, students will be encouraged to further develop their artistic abilities. We will utilize a variety of material including, but not limited to, paint, chalk, origami art and much more. We will also incorporate concepts that have been taught during the year in art classes.

(HS) BASEBALL/SOFTBALL SKILLS -Period 4 (grades 5-8/limit 20) \$5.00

“Baseball Skills” will be offered as a summer school course for all kids finishing grades 5-8. The focus of the course will be improving each kid’s baseball skills and teaching them strategies to help them play baseball more effectively. Students will receive instruction on throwing, pitching, fielding, base running, hitting as well as game play. This course is a great opportunity for kids to have a fun time playing the games of baseball and improving their skills and knowledge. “Softball Skills” will be offered as a summer school course for all kids finishing grades 5-8. The focus of the course will be improving each kid’s softball skills and teaching them strategies to help them play softball more effectively. Students will receive instruction on throwing, pitching, fielding, base running, hitting as well as game play. This course is a great opportunity for kids to have a fun time playing the games of softball and improving their skills and knowledge.

(ZE)CAMP RAIDER (5K-1) – Period 3 (grades 5K-1 / limit 20) Cost \$10.00

For this summer school course, our learners will be engaged in a variety of hands-on high interest camp activities. We will be developing our team building skills, engaging in a variety of outdoor activities, playing hands-on learning games, making decorative t-shirts, creating crafts, building boats, writing camp stories, singing songs, telling stories, making camp foods, hiking and participating in other camp related activities. (HS) COOKING (4-6) - Periods: 2,3,4 (grades 4-6 / limit 20) Cost \$15.00

Good nutrition is stressed while teaching more complex cooking skills. Students will put their skills to work making a variety of foods. They will also learn organizational skills and gain nutrition information. A recipe book containing the recipes used in class will be available at the end of the course. Classes will meet in the newly remodeled Family & Consumer Education kitchens at the high school. Concepts that have been taught during the year in family and consumer economics classes will also be integrated into this course.

(HS) COOKING (7-8) Period: 1 (grades 7-8 / limit 20) Cost \$15.00

Students continue learning good nutrition, kitchen skills as well as organizational skills as they prepare a variety of foods. All recipes used in class will be available in the form of a cookbook at the end of the course. Classes will meet in the newly remodeled Family & Consumer Education kitchens at the high school. Concepts that have been taught during the year in family and consumer economics classes will also be integrated into this course.

(ZE) DO YOU S.T.E.M.?? (1-3) Period 1 (grades 1-3/limit 18) Cost \$10.00

Have you ever wondered how to build a parachute out of a napkin and string? How about sailing a ship made out of aluminum foil? How would you build a catapult out of popsicle sticks and rubber bands? What could you design with a cereal box, tape, scissors and markers? In this class students will have the opportunity to learn how Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (S.T.E.M) can be fun through designing, building, testing, and redesigning to solve problems in cooperative, collaborative and creative ways. Join us for some tasty adventures as we become food artists! Each day we'll make a delicious snack out of all different kinds of ingredients. They will not only be good to eat but healthy for our bodies. We'll discover how we can use our imaginations to make some creative and yummy treats! For children with food allergies parents must provide substitute ingredients as needed. For severe allergies please contact the summer school office before registration to discuss whether this class will be safe for your child at 894-2265. Concepts that have been taught during the year in family and consumer science classes will also be integrated into this course.

(MS) FUN WITH TECHNOLOGY (4-8) – Period: 1, 2, 3 & 4 (grades 4-8 / limit 15) Cost \$7

While having "Fun with Technology", students will explore the newest and coolest tools in technology. New this year, students will get the opportunity to use the Virtual Reality Headsets. They'll also be challenged to use their smarts to BREAKOUT! Much like the well-known "Breakout Rooms" students will have some locked boxes they will be challenged to break into and earn cool prizes! In addition, we'll continue to use the very popular 3D Printers so be sure to think of your own creation! Students will also have the opportunity to use the Green Screen to produce their own videos as they use technology to travel around the world and put themselves into the environment of their choice. In addition, Lego Robotics will be available for kids to play with as well as the iPads and the OSMO's. This class will be one you won't want to miss so be sure to register before the classes are filled! See you soon!

(ZE) GAMES GALORE (5K-1) – Period: 4 (grades 5K-1 / limit 20) Cost \$5.00

Are you ready to have some fun and play some games? We will be learning how to play new and familiar board games including “UNO, BINGO, Monopoly Junior, Checkers, and Connect 4 to name a few. Sign up with a friend for a fun time... Concepts that have been taught during the year in math and technology classes will also be integrated into this course.

(ZE) GAMES GALORE (2-4) – Period: 3 (grades 2-4 / limit 20) Cost \$5.00

Come play and learn some new and familiar board games and card games with your friends! We will play favorites like “Sorry, Checkers, Apples to Apples, Scrabble, Uno, Phase 10 and Spoons!” Sign up with some friends for an exciting time! Concepts that have been taught during the year in math and technology classes will also be integrated into this course.

(MS) HAMMERS, NAILS & THINGS (2-4) – Period: 1, 2, 3 & 4 (grades 2-4 / limit 20) Cost \$15.00

Students will have the opportunity to learn basic woodworking skills-measuring, drilling, cutting, glueing nailing and finishing to create a wood project. Safety glasses are a must and may be purchased at the middle school office. Everything else is supplied for you except safety glasses. Concepts that have been taught during the year in technology education classes will also be integrated into this course.

(ZE) I LOVE HORSES (2-5) – Period 4 (grades 2-5 / limit 18) Cost \$5.00

Students will explore many aspects of horse and pony care including breeds, care and feeding, and the uses of horses. Students will read books, make their own stick horses, compete in horse show games, and even learn to groom and handle a real miniature horse! Concepts that have been taught during the year in math and science classes will also be integrated into this course.

(ZE) KREATIVE KINDERGARTEN (4K) – offered Periods 1-4 as one continuous class (grade 4K) Cost \$17.00

Teachers will increase your child’s readiness for 5K kindergarten through song and movement, reading stories, art projects, playing games, music time, and making snacks related to the weekly themes. Themes include: All About You, All About Me; Summer, Sand & Sun; A-camping We Will Go; Kindergarten Here We Come. Skills practiced include: learning letter names and sounds, learning numbers, learning rhymed words, counting by 1’s and 10’s. Concepts that have been taught during the year in Kindergarten classes will also be integrated into this course.

(ZE) MATH FOR SUCCESS (5K) – Period 4 Cost \$5.00 Referrals Only

Students needing extra help with their math skills are encouraged to enroll. This is an academic course that will offer review and reinforcement of the math curriculum with a focus on basic math facts. Concepts that have been taught during the year in math classes will also be integrated into this course.

(ZE) MATH FOR SUCCESS (1) – (Grade 1 Period 1) Cost \$5.00 Referrals Only

Students needing extra help with their math skills are encouraged to enroll. This is an academic course that will offer review and reinforcement of the math curriculum with a focus on basic math facts. Small group instruction will include hands-on practice, math games, and strategies for problem solving. The students will also be using iReady Math. Concepts that have been taught during the year in math classes will also be integrated into this course.

(ZE) MATH FOR SUCCESS (2) – (Grade 2 Period 3) Cost \$5.00 Referrals Only

Students needing extra help with their math skills are encouraged to enroll. This is an academic course that will offer review and reinforcement of the math curriculum with a focus on basic math facts. Small group instruction will include hands-on practice, math games, and strategies for problem solving. The students will be using iReady Math. A variety of software programs, individualized and small group work, games and activities will be used. Teachers will collaborate with 5-6 grade teachers and plan accordingly. Concepts that have been taught during the year in math classes will also be integrated into this course.

(MS) OUTDOOR GAMES (4-8) Period 4 (grades 4-8/ limit 20) Cost \$5.00

Students will learn a variety of outdoor games that they will be able to play for years to come. For example, washer toss, ladder ball, croquet, steals the bacon, bean bag toss, drip, drip drop, etc. This class will be held outside in back of the Kiel Middle school.

Students are asked to dress appropriately for the weather. If it is a rainy day students will have class held in the MPR room of the middle school. Concepts that have been taught during the year in math and science classes will also be integrated into this course.

In this class, students will learn about nutrition, cardiovascular opportunities, proper strength training techniques, teamwork concepts, and individual skill development in a variety of activities. 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The Summer School Swim Program, located at the High School pool, provides instruction to students of all ages and abilities to develop their swimming and water safety skills. It is designed to give students a positive learning experience. **Classes are open** to students registering for other Summer School classes and to students preferring to take only Swim Class.

Age Limit: To participate in Swim classes children must turn four (4) years old by June 1, 2020. All students must be willing to stay with their instructor and group for the entire class time. Parents or children not enrolled in swim classes are not allowed in the water during summer school lessons.

Students must bring their own swimsuits and towels every day. Swim goggles will be provided. Swim caps may be worn. Flotation devices will be provided by the pool, when needed.

Swim Class Schedule and Transportation
